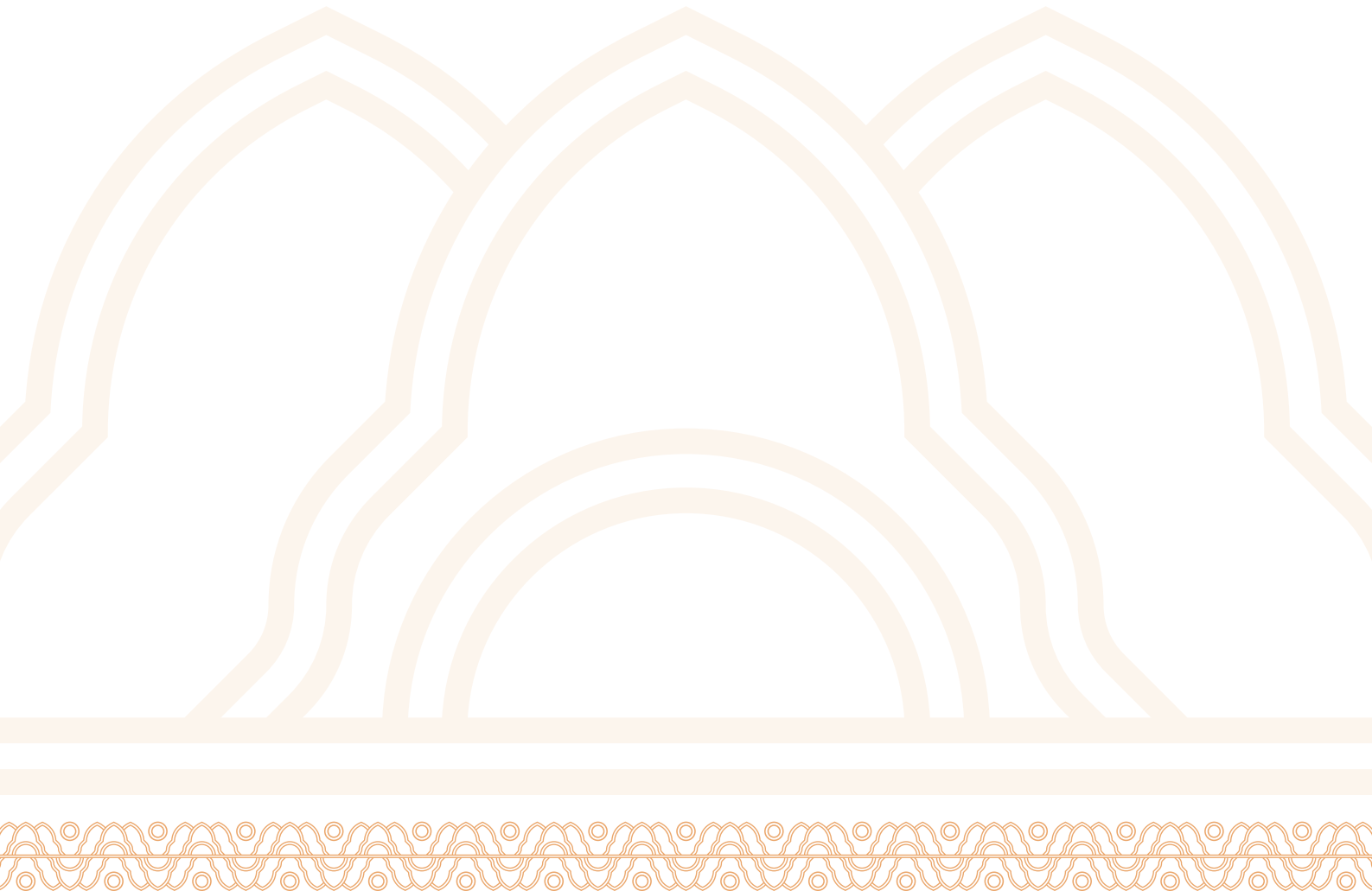

# Emergency





## EMERGENCY

In the event of an emergency, please contact emergency on ext. '0'.

## SAFETY & SECURITY

For everyone's safety, all guestrooms and public areas at Kutaseaview Boutique Resort include an extensive safety system, smoke detectors and fire sprinklers. If during your stay you should need access to emergency services, please dial '0' and we will provide you a list of local hospitals or immediately contact emergency services.

## UPON ARRIVAL

If you have just arrived, please take a moment to spot the exits in your guestroom and familiarize yourself with their locations and your surroundings should an emergency arise. As you head to the main exit on the floor where your guestroom is located, count the number of doors and note any landmarks. In the event of darkness, smoke or other hazards, you can orient yourself by counting those doors and recognizing the landmarks. You may also want to locate the fire extinguishers closest to your guestroom. Please take a look at the evacuation plan at the back of the room door to identify the exit routes in case of an emergency.

## SAFEKEEPING

All guestrooms are equipped with an in-room safe that is available for your complimentary use during your stay. Instructions for operation are located on the safe. The hotel is not responsible for any valuables left in your room or vehicle. In addition, Kutaseaview provides a safety deposit box service right next to reception, should you prefer to protect your valuables outside your room.





## IN CASE OF FIRE

In the unlikely event of a fire, please remain calm and follow these instructions:

### *IF YOU ARE IN YOUR ROOM*

If the fire is outside of your door, test the door with the back of your hand to make sure the door is not hot. If cool, leave the area immediately by stairway. **DO NOT USE ELEVATORS.** If your door is hot, **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR AND DO NOT ATTEMPT TO MAKE AN EXIT.** Remain in your room, call ext. '0', and report your room number (located on your phone).

### *IF SMOKE ENTERS YOUR ROOM*

Turn the air conditioner to the OFF position. Seal any doors by placing wet towels or sheets at the bottom of the doors. Call ext. '0' and report your room number (located on the phone).

## IN THE EVENT OF EARTHQUAKE

- Keep calm and follow the instructions of the emergency broadcast or hotel employees.
- Keep away from all windows or mirrors.
- Extinguish your cigarette and unplug all electrical appliances.
- Open your hotel door and secure your evacuation route.
- Protect your head and evacuate, paying attention to tumbling furniture or falling objects.
- Do not use the elevators during an earthquake – use the emergency staircase.

## BEACH SAFETY

- Beware of undercurrent, especially under receding conditions.
- Stay close to the shore at all times.
- Kuta Beach Life Guard is on duty on the beach from 07.00 am - 07.00 pm only
- Please consult with the life guard if you are not sure about the sea conditions.
- All activities on the beach and adjacent waters are at your own risk
- Do not walk barefoot, and avoid putting bare feet or hands on the coral reef.
- The hotel accepts no liability for any bodily or mental harm suffered, or for any damage theft or loss of personal belonging that could occur on the beach.
- The Sea can be treacherous. Please be on your guard at all times and remain within of flag poles.
- Swimming costumes must be worn, and nudist bathing is considered against the law and offend local customs.





## SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Secure your door by using the double lock mechanism and fastening the safety chain when in your room.
- Store valuable items in the safe provided in the room. The management regrets that the hotel cannot be held responsible for any valuables in your room. Additional safe deposit boxes are available for your valuables at the Front Desk.
- If someone knocks, check the person's identity through the peephole before opening the door.
- If you see a suspicious looking person, contact the emergency line on "0". All The staff wears official identification (name tags) and a uniform. Do not admit any person who is not wearing official identification.

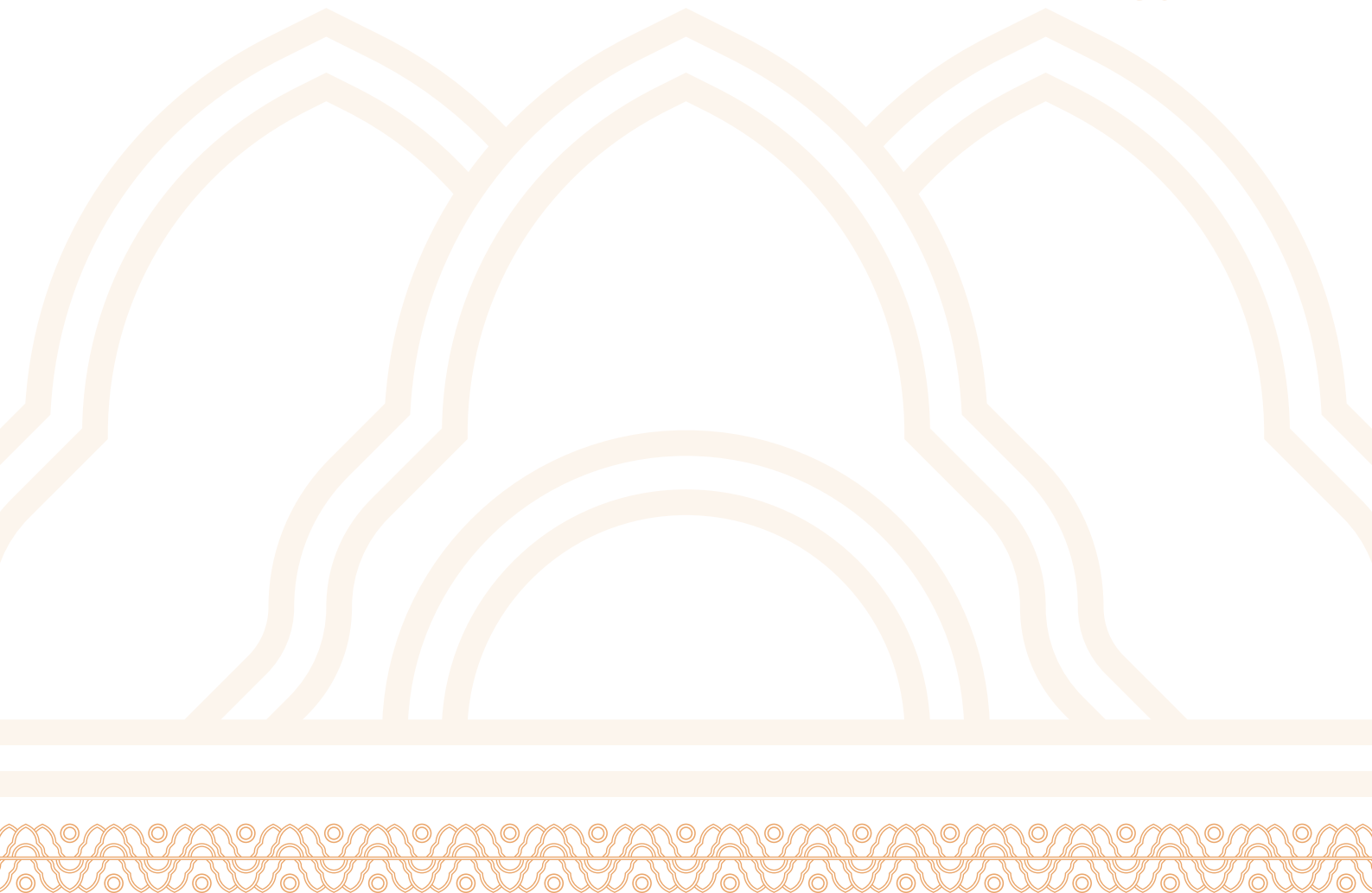

# About Bali





The magnetism of the island of Bali seems to hold captive the hearts' of its visitors. Bali evokes a lingering feeling that is difficult to describe and impossible to explain. It is just meant to be lived and experienced. Once visited, you will be compelled to come back to its beauty, to the people, to its culture, and even to the spiritual and mystical qualities that thickly abide here. This is the place where the heart can rest, the mind is rejuvenated, the body gets invigorated, and new life begins.

Bali has been called many names. Some call it The Island of the Gods and others call it The Island of a Thousand Temples, The Dawning of the world, or The Centre of the Universe. Yet no name can fully describe this truly beautiful, tropical island that is inhabited by remarkably artistic people, who have created a dynamic society with its unique arts, rituals, and spirituality.

Among 17,500 islands across the Indonesian archipelago, Bali is one of the 34 provinces of the Republic of Indonesia. The island administrative government is divided into eight districts that take on names and boundaries from the island's ancient Hindu kingdoms.

Surrounded by the sea, Bali has developed a world of its own and has kept this world to itself for many centuries. In recent decades, the rapid growth of development in tourism has had a large impact and influence on Bali's tradition and lifestyle. Yet the truly Balinese cultures and traditions enable the island to withstand the external influences whilst keeping the island's unique traditions and cultures to continue captivating the hearts of many in comparison to other beach resort destinations.

Daily life on Bali is centered and devoted to satisfying and appeasing the Gods, the good spirits and the demons that live in the breathtaking surroundings of cultivated rice terraces, impressive volcanoes, and pristine beaches. Bali's most well known volcano, Gunung Agung, is still very much active and is considered sacred among local people, as it is believed to be the centre of the universe.

Economically and culturally, Bali is one of the most important islands in Indonesia. Rice is grown on irrigated, terraced hillsides. Other crops include; coffee, copra, tobacco, fruit, and vegetables. Cattle and hogs are also raised. The Balinese are skilled artisans, particularly in woodcarving, painting and in fashioning objects of gold, silver, and others metals into jewelry worthy of the Royal families. The Balinese are noted for their traditional dances, the distinctive music of the gamelan, and for their skill in weaving cloth of gold and silver threads "Songket", as well as embroidering silk and cotton clothing. Bali is also very famous for its traditional food called "Lawar". Each regency has their own special food and local fruit. We highly recommend you to try some of these regional specialties and experience the cultures during your visit. Bali may very well be the "Last Paradise" in the world.

# Attractions & Activities







Kuta, Bali is a must-visit area for every visitor, especially you are well placed for being both right on the one of the best stretches of the famous white sandy Kuta Beach and within a short distance from the bustling and vibrant Kuta's shopping district. In addition to that, Bali has a myriad of pleasant scenic spots and some of the most interesting and famous are listed below.

For further information on tours or visits around Bali, please contact Guest Relations or directly to the Tour Desk who will be delighted to assist you in making all your arrangements.

## RELIGION

The Hindu religion arrived on Bali in the 8th century. Bali's Hinduism or Hindu Darma is today a mixture of Hinduism, Buddhism, and the worship of ancestral spirits. Many rites and ceremonies govern Balinese life. Daily offerings (Canang Sari) of flowers and food along with burning incense are placed in small trays of woven palm leaf and left at various places from the forest glades to supermarket cash registers. These offerings are meant to assure human relations with the Gods and placate unfriendly spirits. Please try not to step on these offerings or touch sacred objects, such as wayang/shadow puppets, masks, or gamelan and avoid sitting higher than a sacred object and honored guest, especially higher castes and priests.

## CULTURE

Bali is rightly celebrated for its tolerance and hospitality, and the average tourists will find no difficulty in adjusting to the local customs. When coming into an unfamiliar cultural setting or social gathering, you may find it helpful to be aware of certain habits and local etiquette. Most of these customs are simply a matter of common sense and good manners, not really all that different from the way one would behave in one's country but a few are special enough to be pointed out.

## THE SIGNIFICANCE OF HEADS ON BALI

The head, especially of a small child, is considered sacred and regarded as the abode of the soul. Please refrain from touching.





### THE MOTHER TEMPLE AND EAST BALI TOUR

Drive to Besakih through various villages, visiting a weaving factory on the way. See the famous painted ceiling at the old “Palace of Justice” in Klungkung, and visit the school of painting in Kamasan. The Mother Temple in Besakih is Bali’s most holy and Indonesia’s Biggest Hindu temple. It was built in 11th Century at an altitude of 1,000 meters on the slopes of Mount Agung.

You will pass picturesque rice terraces on the way to the walled “Bali Aga” village of Tenganan, and continue to Candi Dasa on the East Coast. On the way back it is recommended to stop at the famous Bat Cave “Goa Lawah” where thousands of bats hang from the ceiling.

### KINTAMANI VOLCANO TOUR

A scenic drive over small roads overlooking beautiful rice terraces brings you to the mountain village of Kintamani (about 1,500 meters above sea level), which offers spectacular views of Lake Batur and the Volcano. You can cross the crater’s lake below the still active Mount Batur, and visit the Bali Aga (traditional) village of “Trunyan”. Return through another traditional village called Tampaksiring to visit the Temple of “Tirta Empul” and to visit the Elephant Cave “Goa Gajah”, a hermitage from the 11th century used by both Buddhists and Hindus.

### NORTH BALI

Along the scenic roads that cross the mountains to Bali’s North Coast, you will enjoy beautiful views of picturesque rice terraces and large plantations that grow vanilla, chocolate, coffee, cloves, and even wine grapes. Near the Village of Banjar are the popular Hot Springs where you can take a dip in a natural pond and enjoy mother nature’s wonder. Passing the black beaches of Lovina you will find the old capital of Singaraja on the way to spectacular ‘Git Git’ Waterfall, where you should get some amazing photos.

### MONKEY FOREST & TANAH LOT TEMPLE

Visit the Royal Taman Ayun Temple in Mengwi, (built in 1624), the holy monkey forest (Alas Kedaton), and beautiful Tanah Lot Temple. This picturesque Balinese temple was built in the 16th century on a huge rock 100 meters off Bali’s West Coast, and is surrounded by the sea during high tide.



## BOAT CRUISES

There are daily cruises to the nearby Nusa Penida and Nusa Lembongan islands off the South East coast of Bali. Guests spend the day either at one of the cruise companies beach clubs (with restaurants, swimming pools and water sports) or on a floating pontoon, where you can go snorkeling, scuba diving, take “Banana Boat” rides, or view the underwater world from a semi-submersible vessel.

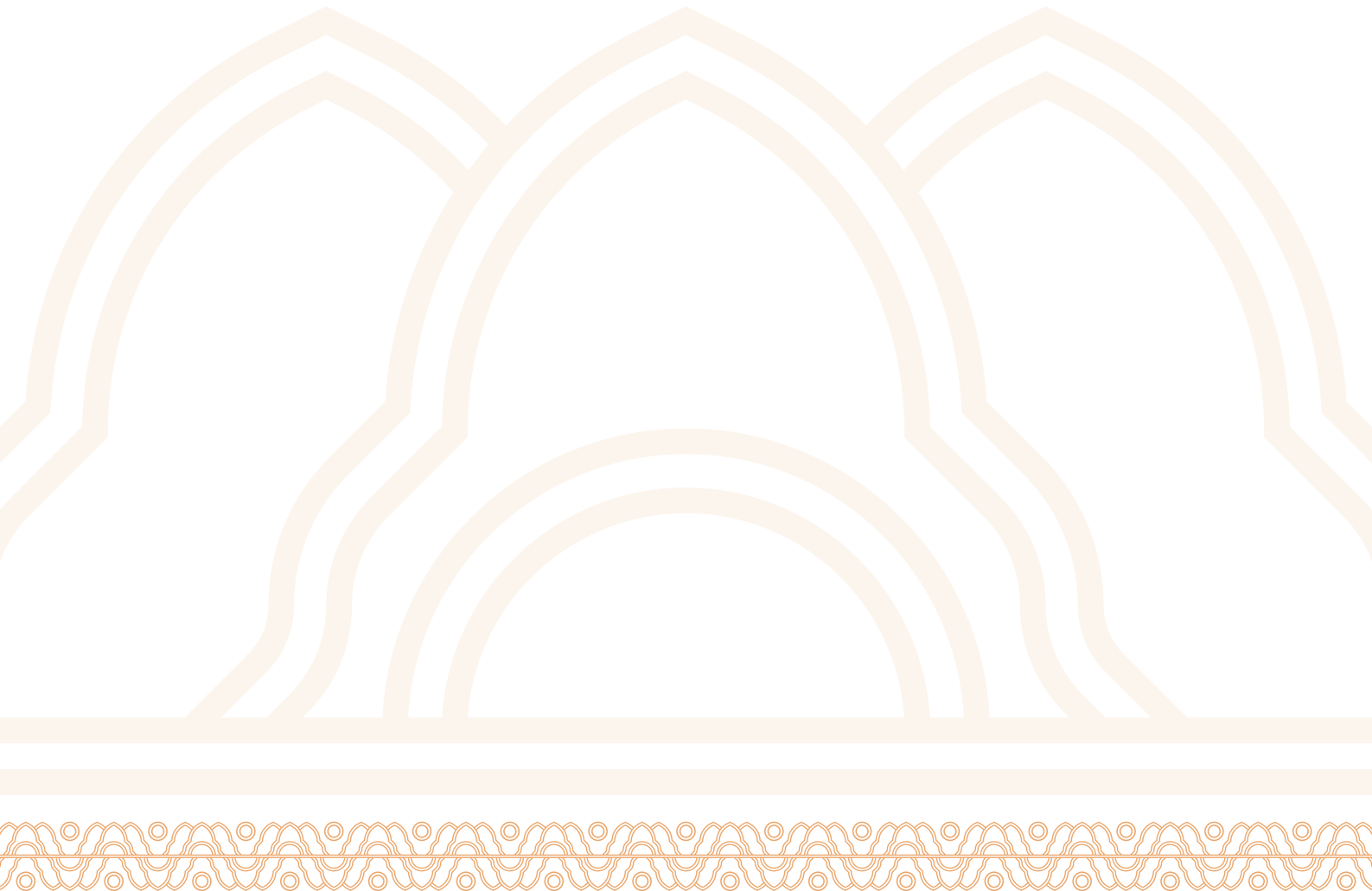
## WATER SPORT ACTIVITIES

Bali has become one of the world’s famous spots for water-lovers, seeking paradise on water. Bali has many surfing opportunities that enable surfers to be immersed with nature or just hang solo in the water, or enjoy popular surfing hubs such as Kuta Beach, where locals and visitors share the same waves. Bali diving is truly impressive from the basic dive that covers naturally brightly colored reefs to mug diving for an astounding assortment of rare marine life that is smaller. Rafting is also very popular in Bali and we have 2 major rivers to cater to it; the Ayung River and the Telaga Waja River.

## BEDUGUL

Drive up into the mountains to Lake Beratan (1,200 meters above sea level) and witness very beautiful scenery. Located just 40 km north of the capital of Bali, Denpasar. The Botanical Gardens are situated in the mountain tourist resort in Bedugul. The cool climate with an average temperature of 18 C, annual rainfall of 3,000 mm and clean air makes this destination very popular for recreation in Bali.
